**REWIND ~ Screening & Discussion**

Sasha Neulinger presented at our CAC conference a couple years ago and his story was passionate and moving. This is his film which has just been released.

Made up of home video footage that reveals a long-kept secret, Sasha Joseph Neulinger's *Rewind* is a brave and wrenching look at his childhood and his journey to reconcile his past. By probing the gap between image and reality, the film depicts both how little and how much a camera can capture. For as long as Neulinger can remember, a video camera was ever-present, with his father constantly filming—from birthday parties and hockey games to holidays. But his father's camera, trained on the frequent gatherings of a tight-knit family, was also documenting a hidden secret, the revelation of which would lead to a media firestorm, a high-stakes court battle, and a generational reckoning. An intensely personal project six years in the making, featuring first-hand interviews with Neulinger's family, and the law enforcement and mental health professionals on the front lines of subsequent legal battles, *Rewind* reframes the perspective on traumatic events from Sasha's childhood, this time placing him in control of the camera, firmly at the helm of his own narrative. As each frame of footage unfolds, so, too, do the layers of this complex and affecting survivor story, the heartbeat of which is Neulinger's vulnerability, bravery, and enduring positivity, against all odds.

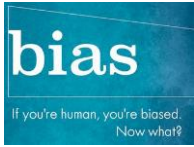
**GENERATION FOUND ~ SCREENING & DISCUSSION**

"As parents, we want to protect our children from witnessing the fear and uncertainty brought by the COVID-19 pandemic. We wish we could take away the disruption to their education, activities, and relationships. And, we wish they were not exposed to suffering.

We cannot control these circumstances, but we can work to strengthen our relationships during this time while building our children's resilience. We can remember to say what so many of our grandparents said to us: "This too shall pass, and you'll get through this with me by your side."

The best way to protect our children is to shape the lessons gained during this difficult time. We do so best when we intentionally manage our own feelings and experiences with an eye toward helping them build resilience (Ginsburg).”

**BOYS DOCUMENTARY ~ Screening & Discussion**

Sex trafficking is a worldwide epidemic, a tragedy that affects women, men, and children. Men and boys throughout the United States fall victim to modern-day slavery and are forced to sell their bodies for sex. While the movement of sex trafficking has brought significant awareness to female victims of trafficking, males have been starkly overlooked.

Boys Documentary seeks to do just that - bring validity to the truth that males are victims of sex trafficking here in the United States.

In January 2014, Chris & Anna Smith joined forces with Kartal Peel to travel across the United States to film BOYS Documentary. Over several years this passion team conducted interviews with survivors, service care providers, and law enforcement in New York, North Carolina, Atlanta, Colorado, Washington DC, Illinois, Philadelphia, and Wisconsin.

Through their interviews, Chris, Anna, and Kartal gained an understanding of what male sex trafficking looks like within the United States. In search of an answer to the enormous problem, they found the rebounding voices of the men who identify as ones with lived experience as the most poppable testimony to healing and reliance. Here in Boys Documentary, they hold space for their stories to be seen, heard, and known.

Boys Documentary tells the narrative of male sex trafficking through the voices of four brave men and a collection of allies who stand with them in solidarity. BOYS Documentary is a clear statement that absolutely boys and men are sex trafficked and our humanities response to be the antidote to this crime by standing with survivors.

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### **SHAKEN BABY SYNDROME ~ A PREVENTABLE TRAGEDY**

The issues addressed in this training include:

- Shaken Baby Syndrome (SBS) and the signs and symptoms
- Areas of the brain that are affected by severe shaking
- What happens physically when a baby or small child is shaken
- How a baby's crying can trigger a caregiver's shaking a baby
- The characteristics or profile of a person likely to shake a baby
- A plan for handling frustration, anger, and stress when a baby cries

This curriculum introduces the Realityworks Shaken Baby Syndrome Simulator™, presents documented information about SBS, and provides activities and discussions designed to educate students and communities about this devastating and preventable injury. This curriculum uses the SBS Simulator and additional teaching aids to educate students about the physical injuries caused by shaking a baby. The curriculum presents the clinical symptoms of a severe shaking, the situations that can lead to a caregiver's loss of control, and ways to anticipate and ease the frustration, anger, and stress that can occur when caring for a baby or young child.

### **HUMAN TRAFFICKING / COMMERCIAL SEXUAL EXPLOITATION OF CHILDREN**

Commercial sexual exploitation of children (CSEC) is a commercial transaction that involves the sexual exploitation of a child, such as the prostitution of children and child pornography. During the training, you will hear compelling stories from experts and survivors about the commercial sexual exploitation of children. You will also:

- Learn what commercial sexual exploitation of children is and what circumstances make children vulnerable.
- Learn about the root causes of commercial sexual exploitation directly from survivors.
- Understand how preventing child sexual abuse reduces the risk for children being commercially sexually exploited.

Hear about actions adults can take to prevent commercial sexual exploitation of children.

Something incredible is happening behind the locked doors of the James Ranch in Morgan Hill, California, the Bridge City Center for Youth in Bridge City, Louisiana, and 162nd St. Sheltering Arms, in the Bronx, New York. Caring and committed staff are using guidance, setting boundaries, and showing unconditional love and compassion to youth offenders.

*Like Any Other Kid* provides a rare glimpse into the inner workings of one of the most promising developments in juvenile justice reform: the use of non-punitive, therapeutic programs to change behavior and help youth re-enter their communities.

Following the intimate relationships between incarcerated youth and staff in three unique facilities across the country over the course of three years, the film shows how these programs work.

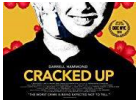
BROKEN PLACES documentary explores why some children are severely damaged by early adversity while others are able to thrive.

To help answer this question, we updated a few of the stories of children growing up in difficult circumstances that we filmed decades ago. It turns out that some of these children were so scarred by abuse and neglect that they are now in mental institutions, correctional facilities, or drug rehabilitation centers. A few died prematurely. However, there are others who managed to overcome comparable childhood stress and are now healthy, self-sufficient adults. Viewers are given a unique time-lapse perspective, witnessing how a few of these troubled children evolved into the adults they are today.

By revisiting some of the abused and neglected children we profiled decades ago, we're able to dramatically illustrate how early trauma shaped their lives as adults. BROKEN PLACES interweaves these longitudinal narratives with commentary from a few nationally renowned experts to help viewers better understand the devastating impact of childhood adversity as well as the inspiring characteristics of resilience.

In **Cracked Up** we witness the **effects adverse childhood experiences** can have across a lifetime through the incredible story of actor, comedian, master impressionist and Saturday Night Live veteran, **Darrell Hammond**. Behind the scenes Darrell suffered from debilitating flashbacks, self-injury, addiction and misdiagnosis, until the right doctor isolated the key to unlocking the memories his brain kept locked away for over 50 years. Cracked Up, director Michelle Esrick, creates an inspiring balance between comedy and tragedy helping us understand the impact of toxic stress and childhood trauma in a new light, breaking down barriers of stigma and replacing shame with compassion and hope.
